Reading and writing at Rosemellin continues to be at the forefront of everything we do and a key priority for our school. We want all our children to have a love of books, thirst for knowledge and the strength to record their ideas accurately and powerfully.

We use high quality texts as the bedrock to all our English learning. All year groups are read challenging but engaging texts as part of their writing lessons which then inspire a multitude of different types of pupil writing. Each class studies high quality longer texts as part of their reading lessons.

Recently, when I walked into one of our year 5 classes and asked for people who wanted to speak to me about the reading and writing that was happening in the class, I was bowled over by the number of children who were desperate to speak to me to tell me about their learning. Here are what a few of them said:

Maisie: I enjoyed The Man Who Walked Between The Towers the most because I really love learning about people with special talents. In today's lesson about The Lost Thing, I've got to design my own weird creature it's called the Space Shape.

Darcy: I loved reading Hidden Figures in class because I like learning about people who didn't give up on what they wanted to do. My favourite bit of writing was the Harriet Tubman biography. We had to draft it in our English books and then publish it so my family could see my writing.

Liam: I loved Percy Jackson because it's a perfect mix of fantasy and modern life. It has lots of different characters and a great storyline. My favourite bit of writing was when we had to design our own book. Fun fact, I brought in my own book which I had made at home based on the plot.

Bailey: Percy Jackson because of the action. My prized bit of writing this year so far is about the characters in Hidden Figures and their lives. The above is a very much abbreviated version – we could have talked for hours! All our children are expected to read at home daily. This helps to develop confident and fluent readers. Home reading is acknowledged and celebrated individually through our Reading Karate scheme and Key Stage 1 reward scheme. All children regularly borrow and read levelled books from school which match and build on their current reading

The best way you can help your child to read easily and with enjoyment is to read daily, talk and listen to them as much as possible, asking and answering questions from an early age. Reading confidently has been proven benefit learners throughout their lives.
