History

History is a fascinating and engaging subject for the children to study and I am proud to give you a little insight into the children's learning in the second part of the year. At Rosemellin, we are eager to look at history through a global as well as a local lens and are keen to emphasise Cornwall's role in History.

In year 1 the children are studying a unit of work called 'Wreck and Rescue' and are looking at Henry Trengrouse of Helston. Trengrouse invented the rocket life-saving apparatus which enabled a rescue line to be thrown from a stranded ship to the shore. Thousands of lives have been saved through his work.

Year 2 have compared the lives of two famous inventors in their studies of Richard Trevithick and Thomas Edison.

In Year 3 The children are plunging back into the classical age and are learning about Ancient Greece. Be prepared for stories, heroes, monsters and daring do!

Year 4 are carrying on this theme and are studying Ancient Rome.

Year 5 are studying the period of History after the Romans left Britain and are learning about Anglo Saxons settlers and the Viking invasions and the birth of the concept of 'England'.

Year 6 are coming back home and are learning about Cornish mining and the dramatic influence which Cornish engineers have had on the world.

The children are always so positive about their historical learning and buzz with excitement when a new topic is revealed! We are very proud of them.

Since 2017, the school has been participating in a project that runs jointly between schools and Devon and Cornwall Police



Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass ensures that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this process is extremely beneficial for all those involved.

Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you are all keeping well. I know these times are challenging and especially so when the news is so difficult to deal with. However, in such madness and horror it does make me glad when someone does something for others that will make that difference.

One of our families is expressing deeply felt concern- as we all are, I know- about the plight of the families in Ukraine. Experiencing the horror of war when every aspect of your life is affected- no home and no job- and being forced to flee the only place you have ever called home is something truly unimaginable. The images that we have seen are truly heart breaking to watch.

As a school we are working with one of our families to arrange a collection of items that would benefit those living in or having to leave Ukraine. Can we ask you, if you are able, to donate any item from the list below for which we would be extremely grateful. The items are those things families are in desperate need of:

- Nappies & wet wipes, including nappies for elderly
- Dry sanitary products
- Thermal clothes and gloves
- Batteries, flashlights and candles
- Food for children – tinned; packets or dry
- Warm blankets and sleeping bags
- Dressings and plasters
- Face masks and hand gels
- Dog/cat food

Can we kindly ask that, if you wish to donate you do so by Thursday 24th March 9.00 a.m and we can then arrange a collection. Any items being donated can be brought to the front entrance where we have a box to receive any goods.
