We are celebrating the 'Month of the Military Child', with the re-launch of our Rosemellin Little Troopers group on Monday 4th April.

Twelve of our Little Troopers children will wear something purple on that day. This will give them the opportunity to explain to others why they are dressed differently and to tell their stories to others of military life.

In the afternoon we will all get together and celebrate with a Military Roadshow.









At Rosemellin, our computing curriculum aims to communicate to children how to be safe and respectful online – something becoming of more importance with the rapidly changing world of technology. To do this, we use a fun and engaging scheme of learning called Gooseberry Planet. The children start lessons by having an open and honest conversation with their class teacher about the 'scenario' the lesson is based around (the lesson focus is detailed on our half term curriculum maps on the school website). Learners then complete a workbook online to check their understanding. Gooseberry Planet often offer online webinars for parents and carers related to online safety looking at current issues – keep an eye on the school class dojo page for these if you would like to find out more.

Alongside online safety, we look at many other aspects of computing such as coding, researching, and using a variety of software. In Year 1, the children have been using BeeBots to understand the concept of coding. They had fun giving the bug shaped machines a set of instructions to follow. In Year 4, learners have been using an online resource to create a storyboard related to Boudicca's uprising and their topic 'Roman Britain.' Across all year groups, children have access to Espresso Coding, which is a fun and engaging way to introduce children to the world of Coding.

Dear Parents/Carers and children

I hope you all enjoyed a fantastic and relaxing weekend-especially if you were treated to a lovely Mother's Day. There is nothing like a bout of sunshine to lift the spirits and make us look forward to the Spring and Summer months (even though an hour was lost and we probably all felt it this morning!)

This week, I am writing to you all to share a decision that I have made. I have decided to retire from education and teaching and have resigned from my role as Headteacher of Rosemellin at the end of the summer term.
