Phonics

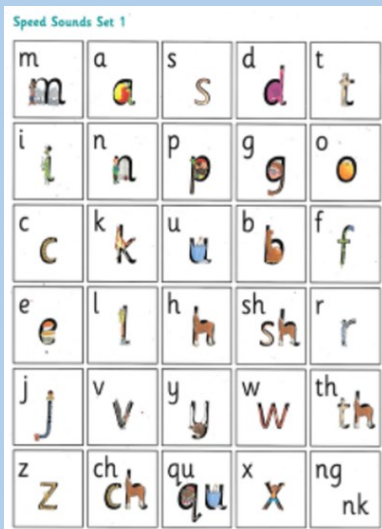
At Rosemellin, our Phonics journey starts in Foundation Stage where the children learn Set 1 sounds and progress on to Set 2 and Set 3 sounds as they enter Key Stage One.

Children are assessed every half term to determine which coloured RWI group is the most suitable for their reading ability.

During RWI lessons children learn a new sound, review previously learnt sounds, read decodable green words, spell words and read a text that has been carefully matched for them.

Whilst learning to read new words, children are encouraged to identify the 'Special Friends' first, then 'Fred Talk' the word before reading the word as a whole.

After half term, our Year One children will be taking part in the Phonics Screening Check. The check contains 40 words that are divided into two sections. Each section contains a mixture of real words and pseudo words. The aim of the check is to ensure that all children can accurately decode words to read.

Last week, we were very fortunate to have our Read Write Inc consultant in school. It is always a pleasure to invite Heather into school to support both staff and children with our RWI journey. Heather was very complimentary on how focused our children were during lessons and was impressed with their reading abilities.

Read, Read, Read

One of the key drivers of our curriculum is that we teach our children to read. It is so important that the children read every evening, even if it is only for 5 or 10 minutes. You will not believe the difference this makes to their ability and, once children can read, the rest of the curriculum becomes a whole lot easier. We are finding that the greatest barrier to our children's understanding in reading is their fluency and children only get better at this with practice. Please, make sure you encourage your child to read. If your child is a little older- in Years 5 and 6- perhaps they can read fluently but would benefit from being asked questions about what they have read in order to check their understanding.
