Dear Parents/Carers

How lovely that the sun is back with us- it makes all the difference to children ...and adults alike. I hope we can all enjoy it safely so please remember to put on suncream and wear sunhats-named- each day.

As a reminder to you all, can I say again how important it is that children arrive at school on time. Our gates open at 8.45 a.m and we have a 15- minute window for children to be in their classrooms.
