Making payments on time



We know this time of the year- and this year in particular - is always challenging when there are various trips to pay for, school meals etc. However, we are noticing an increase in the debt that the school is holding and we need to do all we can to reduce it. If you feel you are eligible for Free School Meals, please apply via the Local Authority's website: this makes a noticeable difference to the amount of money a family has each month if on a lower income.

If you are holding a debt, we ask that you chip away at it rather than just leaving it- schools do not have the money to make up any shortfall. We thank you for your help in this matter.

MATHS

All the Crofty schools have signed up to an online maths programme called Maths-Whizz. This gives the children currently in year 2 to 6 the opportunity to answer maths questions as part of a game. The programme stores information about what they can and can't yet do, making sure the questions are pitched at an appropriate level. We have started using it this week and the children will be able to bring home their login details so they can take part at home. If they do play it at home, it is important that they don't receive help as the programme will think they can do things that are beyond their current ability. The game itself gives teaching points when children make mistakes in order to address any misconceptions.



Over the Summer term, Key stage 2 classes have been focusing on decimals, fractions, shape and time. In Key Stage 1 the focus has been on place value, multiplication and division, shape and time. The children in Key Stage 1 have also been continuing to work hard on the national project 'Mastering Number'. We have seen brilliant progress since the start of the project.

The year 4 classes have recently taken part in their multiplication tables check. Every year 4 child in the country took part in the online tests to check how well they know their times tables. Our year 6 pupils took their SATs tests in May. We are all so proud of their hard work and dedication to achieve their best. Well done year 6!

New schools to join Crofty Trust next year

This week we had the exciting news that the proposal for seven schools from Southerly Point Multi Academy Trust to join Crofty Trust has been agreed by the Regional Schools Commissioner's office.

The staff in the current Crofty Trust schools are really looking forward to working with the Southerly Point staff and will start working together on school improvement in the autumn term.

The schools are likely to legally join Crofty in January 2023 meaning Crofty Trust will look after 16 local schools and approximately 3,500 children.

Exciting times ahead for sure.
