Writing

Writing at Rosemellin

This year, Rosemellin writers have excelled themselves and created a huge variety of wonderful texts. All of our writing at Rosemellin is based around the writing we read through the Literacy Curriculum: the teaching of writing with high quality texts at its core. Within one story, your child may write anything from a news report, to poetry, to stories to a persuasive letter or a playscript (and more!). The variety is embedded from the outset so that, by the time they leave year 6, they are confident with any genre and understand what quality writing looks and sounds like.

By enabling our learners to encounter high quality, age-appropriate writing, through the stories that we study, we allow them to create their own slices of awesome!

I am often asked by parents "how can I get my child to write?". The key is to give it a purpose: many children need a reason to write. Shopping lists, word games, 'convince me' letters (for example, persuading you to allow later bedtimes or more pocket money), scrapbooks, a journal jar, are all ways you can encourage a reluctant child to pick up a pencil.
