FOUNDATION GATE: By the main reception.


MAIN GATE: Cliff View Road gate leading onto Y5/6 playground

Miss Sargent's Message



As they say, 'time flies when you are having fun' and they couldn't be more right. I can't believe we are starting the fourth week of school; the time really is going quickly.

Last week, Year 6's took part in the Stay Safe workshop and our ambassadors were selected. Congratulations to The Stay Safe Mentor's we look forward to seeing all of the work you will be doing to keep our school a safe and happy place for everyone. We are also looking into some workshops that may be useful for parents/carers on internet safety.

Each Monday I lead an assembly using Picture News which teaches children about current affairs in an age appropriate way. It starts with a picture and question linked to something that is in the news at that time. It develops great discussions and enables children to know what is happening around the world. It is my intention to put each news story on Dojo so that you can talk about it at home if you wish to.

Since we have returned to school it has come to my attention that lunch times aren't running as smoothly as they could. I would like to reassure you that we are in the process of improving this provision. We are ordering wrist bands so that children are given the colour of their meal choice and just need to show it when they get to the serving hatch (hopefully speeding up the serving process). A second hotplate has been delivered to school which means we will be able to serve from the new hall as well so the queue time will be cut down. Finally, we are looking to apply for funding for new dinner tables in the old hall so that more children can be seated at a time. I thank you in advance for you understanding whilst we work to improve this time of the school day.
