Please make sure your child's dinner money account is topped up with credit at the beginning of the week. We can send you a reminder password or print a barcode for you to pay cash at a pay point if preferred. If your child is in arrears you will need to provide them with a packed lunch.

HOW IT WORKS:

In the morning your child will order a school dinner at registration time. When they collect it from the canteen they will be marked off on the dinner list. The office will deduct £2.41 from their account.

We are very excited to be bringing 16 author events to St Austell on 17th June 2023. We know the difference children choosing to read can make to their future life chances. The OECD recognises reading for pleasure as the single most important indicator of a child's future success.



The Waterstone's Children's Laureate charter also highlights that children have the right to see an author event at least once. We are providing 16 opportunities for them to see fantastic authors and illustrators.



Events include AF Steadman whose book, Skandar and the Unicorn Thief, is the biggest selling for a debut author in the past 20 years. Sufiya Ahmed who will be using the festival as the South West launch of her brand new World War 2 spy drama, Rosie Raja: Mission to Cairo. Justyn Edwards will bring a touch of magic. There will be dance with Sarah Tagholm and her disco cats, and impossible questions from Isabel Thomas.



We have many fantastic picture book authors including Naomi and James Jones, Clare Helen Welsh, Rebecca Cobb and Jodie Lancet Grant. The wonderful Julie Sykes and Anna Wilson will captivate early chapter book readers.

We are really happy that we have lots of Cornwall based authors and illustrators including Ben Rowswell, Ellie Thompson, Emma Mcann, Tracy Curran and Kate Jane Neal. All of whom have excellent activities planned to entice a variety of interest.



Events will be in White River Cinema, St Austell Library, Unit 4 and a pop up unit in White River Place There will also be a festival book shop where you can meet the authors and buy signed books.



Tickets are just $\pounds1.00$ and you can use the ticket to get $\pounds1.00$ off a book from the Festival bookshop.
