Please make sure your child's dinner money account is topped up with credit at the beginning of the week.

We can send you a reminder password or print a barcode for you to pay cash at a pay point if preferred. If your child is in arrears you will need to provide them with a packed lunch.

### HOW IT WORKS:

In the morning your child will order a school dinner at registration time.

When they collect it from the canteen they will be marked off on the dinner list.

The office will deduct £2.65 from their account.

### TRUST PUPIL COUNCIL

The [Trust Pupil Council](#) is made up of 2 representatives from each of Crofty's 16 schools. We meet at least once per term to talk about ways in which we can work together, across all our schools, to make a positive difference to the environment.

Our Trust councillors give information and messages back to their own School councils and then report back to the [Trust Council](#) about what has been happening in their school.

In July 2023, we had our first [Trust Council](#) summit. We all met together at Pennoweth School and heard from lots of different speakers about ways in which we could help the environment. We also agreed on 8 pledges that we would make to help us care for the environment over the next year.

At the moment, we are looking at ways in which we can reduce the amount of single-use plastic we use. Henry and Finley, our [Trust Council](#) representatives, are asking pupils if they use reusable water bottles in school. They will give their survey results to the Trust Council at the next meeting.
