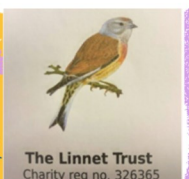

Miss Sargent's Message



Apologies for the lack of correspondence by me on the newsletter for the last few weeks. Unfortunately, I was struck down by one of the many nasty bugs that have been flying around and have been off with the flu and a chest infection. I was so pleased to return to school and made sure I visited every class on the first day so I could see everyone who I had missed so very much. Schools really are a magical place, and you always feel you are missing out on something when you are not there as it is always buzzing with activity. I was particularly sad to miss the singing workshops led by Will Keating, this was clearly a hit with all involved. I look forward to going to the Hall for Cornwall in a few weeks' time to see all the schools come together in a huge sing song.

Seahorses Wrap Around Care

We are very excited to launch our wrap around care after half term. Thanks to those of you who have already signed up. Please contact the office if you would like to request any information about this provision. I would like to say a special thanks to Mrs Kistle who has done the mammoth job of setting everything up for these clubs. It is a huge undertaking to organise the administration behind the scenes and she has been incredible in my absence – I can't wait to hear the feedback once we are well underway. The drop off and collection point will be around the side of the school through the staff carpark, through the wooden gate and the door to the new hall.

Online Safety and Mental Health Week

Whilst we are always reminding the children how to be safe online and talk daily about how we can look after our mental wellbeing this week had a specific focus on these two areas. I would have to say that more and more noticeably, these two things are coming hand in hand. We are finding that there is an increase in children (particularly in Years 5 and 6) being part of group chats which can sometimes become a platform for them to speak inappropriately and intimidate one another. Some of the children have openly said that they would not say this directly to another child but there is a 'keyboard warrior mentality' where they feel happy to do this online. As a school, we are not in a position to stop children from communicating with each other whilst at home however we do ask that you frequently monitor the interactions your child/ren are having on their devices and the time that they are using it. In the last few weeks, we have seen these interactions spill over into school and the children have openly said how 'stressful' they find it getting messages late in the evening/night which can sometimes make it hard for them to go to sleep and then worry about coming to school the next day. It must be so difficult to be in a generation where there is no downtime and as the children have said they feel they have to be on their devices and part of these chats to know what is going on but they wish they didn't have to be. We always say that pupil voice is important to us and I feel that we must listen to how this is making some children feel. We will continue to discuss and educate our children as to how to protect themselves from this but ask that you also work with us from a home point of view.

INSET DAY

Just a reminder that Monday 19th February is an Crofty INSET day. This is an opportunity for us to meet with staff from other schools within the trust and work on a MAT wide project. We will return to school on Tuesday 20th February.
